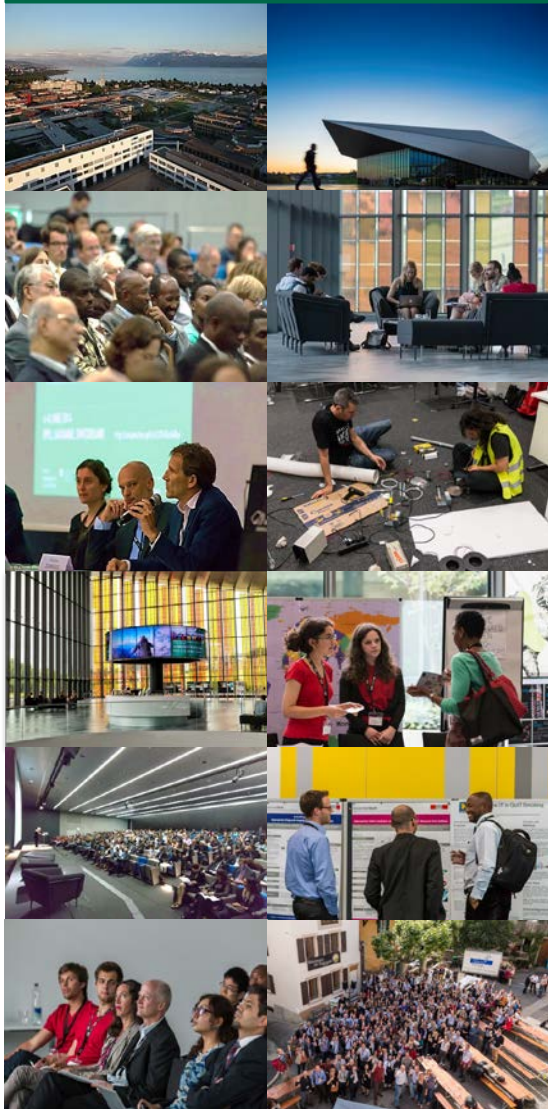

## Call for Extended Abstracts: 6 November 2015

Tech4Dev 2016 invites authors from research, industry, policy, or civil society to submit their *Extended Abstract* focusing on research results, case studies, or challenges relevant to the **Breakout Sessions**. Extended abstracts should emphasize the value of technological innovation while also acknowledging the limits of technology in generating inclusive social and economic development.

### General Information

- Submissions follow a two-stage process:
  - Extended abstract (1,000-1,500 words).
  - Full paper taking into account peer-reviewed feedback provided at abstract stage (5,000 words).
  - The selection of posters will be based on the submission of an extended abstract only.
- Extended abstracts for full paper or poster presentations should be clear, concise, and written **in English**. The abstract must be well written and should be checked by someone well versed in English writing.
- Some level of financial support may be available for authors of high quality papers from developing or emerging countries. Further instructions can be found on the conference website.
- For *full paper* submissions, presenters will be requested to give a 10-minute presentation at the conference, followed by a discussion.
- Presenters of a *poster* will be expected to make a 3-minute presentation during a set time-slot at the Conference to explain their poster and hand out any leaflets, or other information materials, they have available for viewers of their poster. A jury representing the Scientific Committee will be in attendance at the poster presentation to evaluate and select the "Best Tech4Dev Poster."
- The Scientific Committee cannot guarantee that the authors will be granted their preferred choice of presentation (full paper or poster). The decision of the Scientific Committee is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- All presenting authors who are accepted for either a full paper or poster presentation **MUST** be registered and the conference fees fully paid up **by 22 February 2016**. Arrangements and payment of travel and accommodation costs are the responsibility of the participants.

### Review and Selection Criteria

- The Scientific Committee will review all abstract submissions. Abstracts will be evaluated according to a review criteria based on quality, potential impact, innovation, relevance, and presentation.
- Notification of conditional acceptance will be sent to authors **by 7 December 2015**. Authors will be invited to submit a full paper **by 15 January 2016**, in accordance with full paper guidelines to be distributed when the time comes.
- Poster presenters will be notified **by 7 December 2015** and given the technical specifications.
- Authors will receive their peer-review feedback and final decision of acceptance or rejection by **8 February 2016**. Authors will have a short period of time to integrate any reviewer feedback before submitting the final camera-ready paper **by 22 February 2016**.
